A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE ORIGIN AND DEVELOPMENT OF GOBI ARTS & SCIENCE COLLEGE, GOBICHETTIPALAYAM

The seeds for starting the Gobi Arts College (presently known as Gobi Arts & Science College) were sown by Amaras Sri. K.M. Ramasamy Gounder, an eminent educationist and Member of the Legislative Assembly who had served as the Headmaster of the Diamond Jubilee High School, Gobichettipalayam. As the result, an Educational Agency in the name of the Gobi Arts College Council was formed in the year 1967.

The nucleus fund for starting the College came in the form of a generous donation of land worth of Rs. 2 Lakhs from munificent brothers Sri. S.N. Anantharaman and Sri. S.N. Devarajan, the sons of the philanthropic minded landlord Amaras Sri. S.D. Narayanaswamy Iyer.

The institution had its infancy on the premises of Diamond Jubilee Higher Secondary School and was assiduously nurtured by the erudite and sagacious duo Amaras Sri. K.M. Ramasamy Gounder and Amaras Sri. A.R. Somasundaram, a leading advocate and the Correspondent of the DJHS.

When the search was on for a permanent place, a generous gift of 10 acres of land adjoining the Silver Hills near Karattadipalayam came from the Founder Secretary of the Gobi Arts College Council Amaras Sri. K.A. Muthuswamy. Sustained efforts by the founding fathers yielded another 30 acres from the Government and other land owners adjoining the Silver Hills, thus making the new campus a sprawling 46.5 acres in extent.

Under the able and dynamic leadership of Amaras Sri.K.M. Ramasamy Gounder and Amaras Sri. A.R. Somasundaram with admirable assistance from a large number of donor members and the Secretary Amaras Sri. K.A. Muthuswamy, the College started functioning from 11th July, 1968 with Pre-University classes. On 30th July, 1968, the College was formally inaugurated by the then Minister for Education Dr.Navalur V.R. Nedunchezhiyan. In the next year itself, the College was upgraded as a first grade college with the introduction of B.A. Economics and B.Sc. Mathematics.

Destiny dealt a severe blow to the march of the progress of the College due to the sudden and sad demise of Sri. K.M. Ramasamy Gounder followed by the passing away of Sri. A.R. Somasundaram. Notwithstanding these calamities, the rest of the founding fathers rallied around the new President Amarar Dr. K.S. Janakarathnam to speed up the progress of the institution by starting of new courses and construction of new buildings. With the co-operation of all the Council members, the then Secretary Amarar Sri. K.A. Muthuswamy, the then Principal Prof P.N. Silambannan and the Staff, the President was able to collect an amount of Rs. 5 lakhs during 1976-77 which laid the solid financial foundation for the College.

With the financial crunch left behind, new courses like B.Sc., (Chemistry) in 1974, B.Sc., (Physics) and B.Com, in 1975 and a well planned Hostel were also added in the year 1975. Co-education was introduced in 1976 to facilitate the bright young girls who could not go out of the area to continue their higher studies, and also the Semester system in 1976.

Further, courses like B.Sc. (Botany) and M.A. (Economics) in 1979, M.Com. in 1980 and M.Sc. Maths in 1982 were started. BBM was introduced in 1984-85. In the same year, the evening college was started with the introduction of B.Com. course. Keeping in mind the varied needs of the academic field, courses viz., B.Sc. (Computer Science) (1985-1986), Post - Graduate Diploma in Computer Applications (1987-1988), M.C.A. (1988-1989), B.C.A. and B.Com. (C.A.) (2000-2001), M.Sc. (Computer Science) (2003-2004), B.A. English Literature and M.Com. (C.A.) (2004-2005), M.Sc. Physics (2005 - 2006), B.Sc. (Phy - CA) (2006 -07), B.Sc. (IT), M.Sc. (IT) and M.A. (English Literature) (2007 - 2008), B.Sc. (CT) (2009 - 2010) B.Sc. (Maths Unaided) (2015-16), B.Com. (PA) (2015-16), M.Sc. (Chemistry) (2015-16), B.A. Tamil Literature (2018- 2019), B.Com. (B&I) (2019-2020), B.Com (Business Analytics) (2020 - 2021), CLIS (2020- 2021), B.Com (Cost & Management Accounting) (2022-23), B.Sc. (IoT) (2022-23), B.Sc. (AI & DS) (2022-23), M.A. (Tamil Literature) (2022-23) and M.B.A. (2022-23) have been offered.

The Departments of Tamil, English, Economics, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Commerce, Computer Science, Management and Political Science have been upgraded as research departments, offering both part-time and full - time M.Phil. and Ph.D research programmes.

Thanks to the magnanimity and involvement of M/s. Sakthi Sugars Ltd., a sum of Rs.5 lakhs was received to construct the Library and Computer Science Block which is named after Thiru. P.G. Karuthiruman. The progress of the institution is maintained in a high tempo, even though no capitation fee was collected from students. By the efficient financial management of the College Council and the generosity of the persons who helped in procuring liberal donations, additional buildings for Mathematics PG Department and Economics Department were completed without much difficulty. After relinquishing the office of Presidentship by Amarar Dr. K.S. Janakarathnam, who had successfully completed an eventful period of 17 years, Sri. P. Karuppannan B.A., B.L. a leading advocate took over the Presidentship from April 1989 to March 2022. After his retirement, the institution has been functioning under the able mentorship of Er.J.Balamurugan, an eminent scholar and educationist. With the able assistance and guidance of the Founder Secretary Amarar Sri. K.A. Muthuswamy, the College continued its growth with the construction of the First Floor of the Hostel during the year 1989 - 90 and Auditorium and Canteen in the year 1991.

After the demise of the Founder Secretary Thiru. K.A. Muthuswamy on 2-1-1998, Thiru. K.M. Natarajan, B.A., B.L., a leading advocate assumed office as Secretary & Correspondent in January 1998. After the competent service of Thiru. K.M. Natarajan, Thiru.M.Dharanidharan M.F.T. assumed office as Secretary & Correspondent in February 2016.

With two eminent personalities at the helm of affairs, the institution has been witnessing umpteen developments.

In tune with the progress of times, the College became Autonomous in 1987. As a mark of completing 25 years of dedicated service to the people of this area, a Silver Jubilee building to house the college Library and class rooms were constructed in the year 1996.

A separate block consisting of Computer Centre, Administrative Block and Conference Hall was constructed in the year 1998. Thiru S.V. Balasubramaniam, Chairman of Bannari Amman Sugars Limited magnanimously donated Rs.15 lakhs for the development of the institution. The construction of the Botany wing, Men students' toilet, Non - residential women students' centre and extension of canteen had also been added to the infrastructure during 1999 - 2000. The construction of the Second floor of the main building was completed during 2000 - 2001. An annexure to the existing canteen measuring 600 sq.feet was added during 2000 - 2001.

A separate new building was constructed under the M.P. Constituency Development Fund during the year 2001- 2002 and the construction of 15 class rooms were completed in the same academic year.

Adding to the ambience, a Vinayagar Temple was constructed during 2002 - 2003. A spacious hall for Meditation and Yoga Training measuring 4100 sq.ft. and eight class rooms were constructed in the same academic year.

The library was expanded by 16,840 sq.ft and was named after the former President of the College Council Dr. K.S. Janakarathnam. An internet browsing centre is being operational in the library.

To make education more effective and learner centric and ensure flexibility in choosing intra and inter disciplinary subjects according to the choice of the student, the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) was introduced in the academic year 2003-2004.

The College is a recognized as IGNOU Study centre offering B.Com. and M.Com. courses from the academic year 2005-2006. It is also accredited to conduct coaching classes for the Common Proficiency Test (CPT) and Professional Competence Course (PCC) by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India, New Delhi from the academic year 2005-2006. The Centre for Civil Service has been functional from the year 2008 - 2009.

The UGC has accorded approval to the Commerce and Computer Science departments to conduct the Career Oriented Programmes – “Taxation” and “Web page Designing” respectively. The Institution is also the member of the Confederation of Indian Industry (CII) and Erode District Small Industries Association (EDISSIA).

An additional Computer Centre, Conference Hall (named after Amarar A.R. Somasundara Gounder), M.Sc. (Phy) laboratory, Controller Office and twelve class rooms measuring 33,300 sq.ft. were constructed during the academic year 2005 - 2006.

To ensure uninterrupted power supply, 500 KVA HT transformer and one Generator of 62 KVA were installed in the year 2006 - 2007. New toilet measuring 1800 sq.ft. was constructed in the year 2007-2008.

A sprawling Auditorium measuring 28,000 sq.ft. named after Amara K.M. Ramasamy Gounder and Archaeological museum measuring 2500 sq.ft. were declared open in 2007-2008. An exclusive building for IT related courses was inaugurated during this academic year which accommodates three Computer Labs, A/C Conference Hall, Six Class Rooms and a Staff Room. Bharathiar University declared our college as "THE SECOND BEST COLLEGE" in overall performance among all the Arts and Science Colleges under its jurisdiction for the year 2007-2008.

Construction of Non-residential Women students' waiting centre with an area of 15,000 sq.ft. and extension of the Canteen had been completed.

In-door Stadium has been constructed with International Standard at the cost of Rs. 3 crores to facilitate Playing the games like Basket ball, Volleyball, Shuttle, Table Tennis and Gymnasium for both Boys & Girls separately. Flood-Light facilities are also provided for playing the Games during the night. It comprises dormitories separately for boys and girls those who are coming from other Colleges or Universities to take part in the Games and Athletics.

Construction of bridge connecting library and IT building, Erection of 20 KW solar plant, Construction of Post Graduate Laboratory and Class rooms with an area of 5000 sq. ft., Extension of gallery on northern side of playground, Construction of Bank of India ATM and Construction of two units of rain water harvesting were completed during the academic year 2014-15. Construction of fitness centre with an area of 14,500 Sq.ft., and Golden Jubilee building with an area of 24,000 Sq.ft. was completed in the academic year 2016 - 2017. Golden Jubilee Arch and Arts Library Building Completed with an area of 18,000 Sq.ft. in the academic year 2017-18.

The Institution has been accredited with 'A' Grade by NAAC (4th Cycle). OBE curriculum has been introduced to meet the expectations of an academically challenging environment from 2019-2020.

The college has been ranked 57th in the country by National Institute Ranking Framework (NIRF) in 2018. The college was ranked 2nd in India with Best Value for money by India Today MDRA in the year 2018 and also ranked in 2019 and 2020.

The college has been recognised as DBT star college by Govt. of India during 2020 and the science departments have been received recognition for DST-FIST, Govt. of India in 2020 and the college has been recognised as mentor college by UGC Paramarsh scheme in 2020.

CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS) GUIDELINES AND REGULATIONS

To make education more effective and learner centric, restructurisation of curriculum becomes essential. As a positive step in this direction, it was introduced the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) from the academic year 2003-04 and the Outcome Based Education (OBE) was introduced from the academic year 2019 - 2020. Under this system, the academic programme becomes student-oriented, relevant, interdisciplinary and flexible. Apart from the core subjects offered by the departments, the student is at liberty to choose subjects of his/her choice offered by other departments also. Besides, the student has an opportunity to learn extra subjects, for which classes will be conducted outside the regular working hours and he/she can earn extra credit in addition to the mandatory credits required of him/her to qualify for the degree.

I. General Objectives of CBCS

- ☞ To enlarge and enrich the curriculum and to make education broadbased, i.e., more knowledge and skill oriented.
- ☞ To ensure flexibility in choosing intra and interdisciplinary subjects, according to the choice of the students.

- ✎ To enable the interested students to earn extra credits.
- ✎ To facilitate the students to learn at their own pace.

II Definitions and explanations of concepts/terms

Credit	: The weight assigned to each paper/subject, based on the quantum of work required of a student.
Paper/Subject	: It refers to a theory or practical subject offered in a semester. Eg : Micro Economics, Business Law, Organic Chemistry.
Course	: It refers to the faculty under which the paper/subject is offered. Eg : B.A., B.Sc.
Major	: It refers to the discipline of study offered under each course. Eg: Economics, Mathematics.
Major (Core)	: It is the subject which is essential for (Distributed over getting adequate knowledge in the chosen all semesters) course/major of study.
Major (Optional) (V Semester)	: It is the subject offered by other Major Departments. which can be chosen by a student irrespective of the major to which he/she belongs.
Allied (Core)	: It is the subject offered by a department other (I, II & III Semesters) than the major department or by the same department, the study of which is supportive and relevant for the core subject, hence compulsory.
Allied (Optional)	: It is the subject offered by a department other (IV Semester) than the major department which may be studied by any student irrespective of the major to which he/she belongs.

Skill based subject : It is the subject offered by the major department (VI Semester) concerned consisting of theory and practical, to impart skills in the area identified by the department.

Supportive : It is the subject offered by a department other than (P.G.) the department concerned, the study of which is supportive and can be chosen by any student, irrespective of the department to which he/she belongs.

Communicative English

To enable the students to acquire skills in English Communication, Communicative English Course will be conducted for all P.G. Programmes (I & II Semester) from 2021-2022 batch, outside the Curriculum. Certificates will be issued to the students who complete the programme successfully.

SET/NET

The self study paper viz., General Paper on Teaching and Research Aptitude is introduced for all PG courses in III semester. The online system of examination and evaluation is to be followed. If the candidates fail to attend in the concern semester are allowed to appear in the subsequent semesters. Attending examination is made compulsory to obtain the respective PG degree and the appropriate certificate will be issued on the completion of the course.

To enable students to acquire extra credits apart from the mandatory credits, the following subjects are offered outside the regular working hours,

(before 10 AM and after 4 PM) with 1 credit for each subject. The student can opt for maximum of two subjects per annum (Odd & even semester of II/ III year) for UG and PG courses.

1. Fine Arts (Music, Dancing, Rangoli, etc.)
2. Gardening and Mushroom Culture - (Botany)
3. Doll making
4. Fashion and Costume Design
5. Object Oriented Programming in C++ - (Computer Science)
6. Photoshop
7. Cell Phone servicing & Maintenance

9. Massive Open Online Course (MOOC)*
10. National Programme on Technology Enhanced Learning (NPTEL)*
11. Spoken Tutorial *
12. Study Webs of Active - Learning for Young Aspiring Minds (SWAYAM)*
13. Tamilnadu Skill Development Corporation (TNSDC)*
14. National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC)*

* To Enroll and Successfully Complete and after the Certification from the Authority Concerned, he/she will be awarded with an Extra Credit.

A student who has studied a paper under extra credit courses during his/her second year is not permitted to opt for the same subject during third year.

VI Mentor - Mentee

To help the students to plan their optional papers of study and to offer general advice on the academic programmes, a student will be assigned to a member of the faculty (Major Dept) who will function as “Mentor” throughout his/her period of study.

The Mentor will counsel students on matters relating to the choice of subjects, withdrawal, etc. The student will meet his/her Mentor at least three times during the semester.

VII Departmental Committee

Every major department will have a Departmental Committee consisting of

1. The HOD - Convenor
2. The faculty advisors of the department
3. Student representative of each class

The departmental committee is to meet at least thrice a semester to review all matters relevant to the academic programme. It is the responsibility of the HOD to keep the records, viz., the Agenda, Notes, Minutes, and Diary, etc.

VIII Registration procedure for optional subjects

- Registration for the optional subjects should be done with the subject teacher in consultation with the Mentor.
- Students are expected to register for subjects intended to be credited during the next semester on specified dates in the current semester and obtain the initials of the subject teacher on the registration card. For semester I, they will register at the beginning of the semester.
- Students are permitted to withdraw from a subject for valid reasons after one week of its commencement, on the recommendation of the Faculty Advisor with the consent of the Head of the Department of the student.
- Students may register, with the approval of the subject teacher concerned, for another subject in lieu of the subject from which they have withdrawn, during the second week of the semester subject to the availability of vacancy.

IX Minimum requirements for the U.G. and P.G. degree courses

a) Credits:

A student must necessarily complete and earn a minimum of 140 credits (Parts I, II, III, IV & V) to qualify for the Under-Graduate Degree.

A student must earn the minimum credits allotted to each of the P.G. degree programme to qualify for the degree. In case of M.C.A., M.Sc., (CS), M.Sc. (IT) and PGDCA programmes, students have to complete the programme within 4 years and 2 years respectively.

b) Attendance :

- (i) A student will be permitted to take the End of Semester Examinations provided he / she has a minimum of 75% attendance. If his / her attendance is between 65% and 74%, he /she will have to apply for condonation of the shortage of attendance on payment of a prescribed fee. However, the power to condone or to deny condonation of shortage of attendance rests with the Principal.
- ii) In case the shortage of attendance of a student exceeds the limit prescribed for condonation of attendance, he/she will not be permitted to appear for the End of Semester Examination.
- iii) Those students, who could not write the End-of-Semester Examination can continue their studies in the subsequent semester. However, the student with less than 50% of attendance in any semester will not be allowed to continue his/her study in the subsequent semester and he/she will be permitted to rejoin the semester where the attendance is less than 50% and continue the course.
- iv) Deficiency of attendance in one semester shall be compensated in the subsequent semester such that the combined attendance for any two semesters will be taken into account for determining the eligibility of a student to be permitted for the EOS Examination.
- v) A student will be given only one opportunity to carry forward the deficiency in attendance of one semester during the degree course, failing which he/she has to re-do the course with the permission of the University.

c) Number of appearances

- The candidates with arrear in one or more subjects in U.G. Courses shall be given six chances including the first appearance, (except Part -I Tamil) to be taken successively under the same syllabus, i.e. The syllabus that obtained at the time of first appearance. In case of candidates having arrears after availing six chances, they shall have to take up their examinations under the syllabus then in force. In respect of Part - I Tamil, candidates with arrears shall be permitted

to have two chances only, including first appearance under the same syllabus.

- The candidates with arrear in one or more subjects in P.G. Courses (Two year courses) shall be given four chances including the first appearance, to be taken successively under the same syllabus, i.e. The syllabus that obtained at the time of first appearance. In case of candidates having arrears after availing four chances, they shall have to take up their examinations under the syllabus then in force.
- If a candidate of MCA., M.Sc. Computer Science and M.Sc. (IT) does not complete the course successfully within a period of 4 years (2 + 2 years i.e. 8 semesters) from the date of his / her joining, he/she will have to re-register and re-do the full course.
- If a candidate of PGDCA does not complete the course successfully within a period of 2 years (1+1 year i.e. 4 semesters) from the date of his/her joining, he/she will have to re-register and re-do the full course.

X Testing and Evaluation System

a) Evaluation of students is based on both Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) and End of Semester Examinations (EOS) to be held at the end of each semester. The EOS Examinations shall be of three hours duration.

XIII RANKING

Candidates who have secured 60% and above in aggregate and passed in first attempt in all papers in Part III are eligible for the award of Rank Certificate on payment of the prescribed fee. Marks secured by way of improvement will not be taken into account for ranking purpose. Ranking will be given to the first three highest scores only.

XIV Special Provisions

a) Appeal concerning the marks awarded in CIA

- (i) A candidate who is not satisfied with the marks awarded to him/her in continuous assessment may appeal first to Head of the Department concerned within 5 days from the date of announcement of marks/ issue of mark sheets.
- (ii) After the matter is disposed off by the HOD, the candidate may, if he/ she chooses, appeal to the duly constituted committee through the Principal immediately.

b) E.O.S. Examination

Provision for Transparency, Revaluation & Retotalling (For U.G. & P.G Programmes)

- i) **Transparency in Examinations :** Any Student, not satisfied with the marks awarded in the End of Semester Examinations, can apply for the Xerox Copies of valued answer scripts (theory only) by paying the prescribed fees.
- (ii) The revaluation is applicable to E.O.S. Examination of all semesters in the case of UG & P.G Programmes.
- (iii) Candidates of U.G. & P.G Examinations are eligible to apply for retotalling / revaluation on payment of the prescribed fees.
- (iv) The revaluation of answer scripts is to be done only by the external Examiners.
- (v) **Procedure for transparency or revaluation or retotalling:**

The application should be submitted to the Controller of Examinations through the Principal within 10 days from the date of issue of mark sheets or the date of announcement of marks, whichever is earlier.

c) Improvement (for UG & P.G Courses)

- i) A candidate who has passed in any of the theory papers in any semester (Excluding U.G. & P.G Final Semester) and desires to improve his/her score in those papers shall do so in the next succeeding semester itself.
- ii) Only one attempt for such improvement shall be permitted.
- iii) Marks secured by the candidate by way of improvement will be substituted for the marks secured by the candidate in the first attempt, if the former is higher than the latter. Otherwise, the marks secured in the first attempt will remain unchanged in the relevant records.

d) Supplementary Examination

Supplementary Examinations will be conducted for the final semester subjects of UG & PG Programmes for those who register and fail or who register and absent for the final semester anyone theory subject, provided such candidates had passed in all the Examinations of previous semesters and provided further that such candidates should have passed the practical/project work and viva - voce Examinations of the final semester. Supplementary Examinations shall be conducted after the publication of the results of final semester Examinations.

e) Special Supplementary (EOS) Examination :

When a student could not write the EOS examination due to participation in the college/university sponsored sports/ NCC and other state or national significant activities with the prior permission from the Principal on a specified EOS exam day, he/she shall be permitted to have Supplementary EOS exam of ODD/EVEN Semester, with effect from November 2013 Examinations.

Payment of fees

The fees shall be paid in one lump sum not later than the fifth working day.

Payment with fine

If a student fails to pay his/her fees on the date fixed, a fine of Rs.1 per working day shall be levied. If it is not paid within 30 days from the opening of the College after the holidays by any of the students his/her name shall be struck off from the rolls. Absence from College with or without leave letter is not the ground for exemption from the operation of this rule. If re-admitted, he/she shall, in addition to fees and fines, pay re-admission fee of Rs.5/-

Transfer and other Certificates

A student applying for Transfer and Conduct certificates during the semester or within the year and after leaving the College shall be given such certificates upon payment of all fees, fines, etc.

In case of the student leaving the College at the close of the academic year, the Annual certificate shall be issued

(a) If in the opinion of the Principal, his / her progress and conduct have been found to be satisfactory and

(b) If the student has earned sufficient attendance in accordance with the University rules.

The Principal has the right to issue Transfer Certificate to any student at any time in the course of the academic year and thereby compel him/her to leave the college for reasons for indiscipline, lack of progress in studies, non-payment of fees to the College and illness considered to be contagious.

Attendance and leave of absence

1. No student shall absent himself / herself from the classes without leave letter.
2. Except in case of illness or other unforeseen circumstances, all applications for leave must be made beforehand to the Principal or to any member of the Staff authorized by the Principal.

3. In case of illness and other unforeseen circumstances, an application for leave must be submitted as soon as possible and not later than the first day the student attend the College.
4. Students are required to bear in mind that applying for leave does not necessarily imply that it will be granted.
5. Leave applied in time will ordinarily be granted when proper reasons are given but in case of illness extending over more than 5 days, the student shall produce the Medical certificate.
6. Attendance will be taken during every hour of work.
7. A student who absents himself / herself from the class during any hour of the session without leave letter will be considered absent without leave for that session and loose the attendance for the session.
8. Students who attend classes during the first hour and if they have to leave their class during the subsequent hours for valid reason should obtain permission of the staff concerned along with written application for leave and present in person, otherwise their absence will be treated as truancy.
9. The certificate of attendance required for admission to the End of Semester Examination will in no case be granted unless,
 - i) The student's progress and conduct have been satisfactory.
 - ii) The student has attended the required number of working days in that semester.
10. Application for leave from students residing in Hostel should be countersigned by the Hostel Deputy Warden.
11. Leave of absence from composition classes, practical classes and class tests will be granted only if permitted by the staff concerned.

CO-CURRICULAR AND EXTRA – CURRICULAR FORUMS / ACTIVITIES

1. National Service Scheme (NSS*)

The NSS wing has four units with the sanctioned strength of 400, functioning under the guidance of four programme officers. Any student, either in the aided or unaided stream, who has penchant for social service may get enrolled in NSS. Besides regular activities, a seven day special camp focusing on tree plantation, creation of awareness regarding personal hygiene, AIDS, Blood donation, Environmental protection, etc. is organized every year. The wing pays attention to the all round development of the students.

2. National Cadet Corps (NCC*)

The NCC Army wing with the sanctioned strength of 95, is under the command of a Commissioned Officer. Both boys and girls students who wish to improve their personality and leadership qualities and aspire to take up various positions in the army may get enrolled in NCC. The cadets may appear for 'B' and 'C' certificate examinations after fulfilling the requirements prescribed by the authorities.

3. Youth Red Cross (YRC*)

This is yet another service organization with special focus on service to the society. Both Men and Women students may get enrolled in this forum. Training in Health Care, First Aid, Fire Fighting, Rescue Activities, Personality Development are the salient features of YRC. It also lends helping hand in the housekeeping of the institution.

4. Yoga & Meditation Club*

The Club aims at helping the students to be fit, both physically and mentally. The club functions under the guidance of well qualified teachers in Yoga & Meditation. Besides imparting training in Yoga & Meditation to both men and women students, the club gives special emphasis on the 'Kaayakalpa' training.

5. Social Service League (SSL*)

This forum besides taking up social service activities focuses its attention in the upkeep of the premises of the institution. Both men and women students may get enrolled in this forum.

6. Physical Education (With Fitness Centre*)

With the objective of improving the health and fitness of the youth, the fitness centre with many state of the art equipments is established for both men and women students. The centre functions under the supervision of the Director of Physical Education. The students may avail the facilities between 6.30 A.M and 9.00 A.M and between 4.00 P.M. and 6.00 P.M.

7. Citizen Consumer Club*

The club has the objective of creating awareness regarding consumer rights among the students. It also organizes various programmes such as awareness rally, street plays, etc., to spread the information relating to consumer rights among the rural masses.

8. Gender Champions Club*

The broad objective of a Gender Champions Club (GCC) is to provide an integrated and interdisciplinary approach to understanding the social and cultural constructions of gender that shape the experiences of women and men in society. The aim is to make the young boys and girls gender sensitive and create positive social norms that value the girls and their rights.

9. Rovers and Rangers

The purpose of scouting is to encourage the physical, intellectual, social, emotional and spiritual development of young people so that they take a constructive place in society as responsible citizens and as member of their local, national and international communities.

Note: The forums bearing * marks are co-curricular activities. Every student shall participate at least, in any one of these forums for a period of not less than 2 years (4 Semesters) with 2 hours per week. i.e 30 Hrs.

per semester. Students participating in any one of these programmes should earn a minimum of 75% attendance in the chosen programme.

10. Book Depot

Supply of Text books, reference books and study materials to the students are taken care of the book depot. The Depot places orders for books and study materials and distributes to the students well in time.

11. Career Guidance and Placement Cell

The cell provides Guidance and Counselling to the students regarding higher studies and conducts coaching, model tests, group discussions, mock interviews etc. It also arranges for campus interviews for placement in various organizations. Being housed in a separate room, the cell works between 9.00 A.M. and 10.00 A.M. and between 4.00 P.M. and 5.00 P.M

12. Centre for Civil Services

The centre is formed with the objective of creating awareness among the students and motivating them to appear for the civil services examination. The centre also offers intensive coaching for competitive examinations for selected students.

13. Fine Arts & Cultural Programme Club

The Club intends to create fervour and passion among the students in fine Arts. The raw talents in music, painting, drawing, drama, dance etc. are being honed through this club.

14. Blood Donors' Club

The club with the noble intention of helping the poor patients of this area and it has staff and students as its members. Any student may become the member of the club, get identified the blood group and donate blood whenever requisitions are received from the deserving patients.

15. Students' welfare and Counselling Centre

With the objective of taking care of both physical and mental welfare of the students, welfare and counselling centre has been constituted. To be Housed in a separate room, the centre is manned by five staff members, out of whom two are women. Students, both boys and girls having grievances and emotional problems may feel free to meet the counsellors and get counselling.

16. Student Thinkers/ Debating Club

The analytical and critical thinking of the students are honed by this club which comprises of both teachers and students. The Club meets at least once in a month and discusses topics of current issues; thereby the participants get more insight and clarity regarding the issues.

17. Examination Grievance and Redressal Cell

The cell deals with the grievance of the students relating to the Internal Assessment tests and End of semester examinations. The students may bring their complaints, if any, regarding question papers, marks, and grade awarded issues of marks / grade sheets etc., to the Cell for appropriate action.

18. Students Union, Tamil Peravai & Subject Associations

The students' union is formed with the selected representatives of various major departments. The selection of the representatives is done on merit basis and the student getting first rank will be the representative of the class. The representative of third year of the particular major subject will be the secretary of that association. From among the secretaries of various Associations, Student Union Chairman and Tamil Peravai chairman are nominated on rotation basis.

The Students' Union and Tamil Peravai enhance the organizing and leadership skills of students. These Forums organize many activities such as invited speeches, debates, oratorical competitions, etc. The subject Associations also organize various meetings and conduct a number of competitions.

*Research committee,*Grievance Redressal & Counselling Centre, *Economically and Socially Weaker Section Welfare Committee, *Library Committee, *Women Students' Development Cell, *Women Students' Harassment Prevention Cell, *Data and Documentation Centre, *Photography and Painting Club, *Discipline Committee, *Science Club, *Environmental Club, *Community and Extension Centre, *Examination Committee, *Creativity and Soft Skill Development Cell, *Sports & Games Development Cell, *Hostel Committee *News Letter Editorial Board, *Video Conferencing club, * Magazine Editorial Board and *NET-SET Coaching Forum.

19. GAIT : (Gobi Arts Association of Information Technology)

Gobi Arts Association of Information Technology is an association formed by the Department of Computer Science. It is a Forum through which the students improve their leadership qualities and organizational abilities. Guest Lectures, Seminars etc., are also regularly organized through this outfit. GAIT conducts intercollegiate meet (QUTRIX) and intra collegiate meet (GAITFEST) every year.

20. QUTRIX

It is the annual technical extravaganza and the state level technical symposium conducted during the month of March every year. Qutrix invites students of Computer Science from various Institutions and Universities of TamilNadu and Pondichery. This helps the students of Computer Science and the participants to improve the communication skills, organizational abilities, leadership qualities and develop the spirit of team work among them.

21. Gobi Arts Eco Protection and Service (GAECOSERV)

A special team was formed to collect used plastic materials like used pens, pencils etc in the campus and the same sent for recycling to the factory with an ultimate aim of maintaining our campus as clean and green.

22. GASC Alumni Association

This Association aims to work for building a better academic atmosphere in the college. The Association arranges free coaching classes for Public Service Commission Exams and Banking Service Exams for all aspiring Candidates. The association plays a very constructive and collaborative role not only in the college, but also for society at large.

22. Gobiarts Sports Academy

Gobiarts sports academy is to create a platform for promising individuals in sports. Training will be given to all young sports aspirants and school students in and around Gobichettipalayam individually by highly qualified coaches with well equipped infrastructure to compete at National level.

College Day Prizes

Two Prizes will be awarded every year in each subject in B.A., B.Sc., B.Com., B.B.A., B.C.A., B.Com (CA)., M.A. M.Sc., M.Com., and M.C.A. to students who obtain the highest total in the concerned subject.

The College Union will hold Oratorical contest and Essay competition in English to students of under graduate and post graduate classes. Students will be awarded two prizes each for Oratorical and Essay writing competition.

The Tamil Peravai will also hold similar contests in Tamil and will award prizes in the same manner as the College Union.

This Scholarship is meant for the students irrespective of their religion / community / caste.

The best students shall be adjudged on the basis of exemplary conduct, helpfulness, initiative and keenness for selfless service and outstanding performance in studies and sports.

4. O.A. Ramasami Gounder Endowment Scholarship

Two Scholarships for the best students, one from II M.Com. and another from III B.Com. of this College are awarded each year during the College Day Celebrations. The best students will be adjudged on the basis of exemplary conduct, helpfulness, initiative and keenness for selfless service and outstanding performance in studies.

The endowment offers prizes and certificate to the winners who secure I and II place in the Quiz competition in 'QUTRIX' conducted by the Dept. of Computer Science.

"Gobi Arts & Science College NSS Endowment" has been instituted for the Best NSS Volunteer Award from the academic Year 2002-2003. One

NSS Volunteer from each unit, completed two years in NSS will be given the award during the NSS day celebrations every year.

7. Dr. K.S. Janakarathnam Memorial Academic Achievement Endowment

Dr. K.S. Janakarathnam Memorial Academic Achievement Endowment has been instituted by the GASC Alumni Association of North America from the Academic year 2003 - 04. The students of the final year UG and PG classes who stand first in the class in the first attempt from the first to the penultimate semester are awarded the prize.

8. Dr. K.P. Kandasami Achievement Endowment

Dr. K.P. Kandasami Achievement Endowment has been instituted by the Commerce Alumni (1977 - 80 batch) from the Academic year 2010 - 11. A student, who stands first, in the final B.Com. will be honoured with a Gold Medal.

9. GAC Alumni - MCA 88-91 Endowment

GAC Alumni - MCA 88-91 Endowment has been instituted by the first batch (1988-91) MCA Students of the College from the academic year 2013-14. This fund will be provided for the financially and academically deserving First, Second and Third year MCA Students of the aided Courses.

10. A. Karuppayammal Endowment

Scholarships for economically backward and educationally good students are awarded every year.

11. Arumuga Gounder- Perumayammal Endowment

The endowment offers financial assistance for economically backward students pursuing B.A. Economics.

12. Student Welfare Fund

The fund has been instituted to help the needy economically backward students by staff and students.

13. P.N. Sengodappan Sports Achievement Award

The Award is instituted to honour the individual champions in both men and women categories at the college level.

14. A.R. Somasundaram Endowment :

The Endowment has been instituted by Dr. Anandhi Arul, College Council Member and her Relatives (2018). The fund will be utilized to provide Financial Aid to economically backward and Meritorious students.

15. M.R. Ramalingam and K.K.Kandhappa Gounder Endowment:

The Endowment has been instituted by Tmt. K.Akilandeswari, MCA Alumni (2003-2006 Batch) from the Academic year 2017. The fund will be utilized to provide Financial Aid to economically backward and Meritorious students.

16. Dr. K. Arangasamy Endowment :

The Endowment has been instituted by Dr. A. Anbarasu, 15, Tamil Nagar, Gobi(2018). The fund will be utilized to provide Financial Aid to economically backward and meritorious students.

17. Dr. Priyadharshini Kumaraswamy Endowment :

The Endowment has been instituted by Dr. M.R. Kumaraswamy, Assitant Professor of English, Gobi Arts & Science College(2018). The Endowment offers Financial Assistance to economically backward and meritorious Girl students pursuing B.Sc. Botany.

18. Financial Aid by Nisaptham Trust, Gobichettipalayam :

The trust provides financial assistance worth of Rs.5,20,000 (College Fee & Hostel Fee) to 12 girls Hockey Players from 2019-2020 onwards.

19. B. Ananthkumar (MCA 1994 - 1997) Memorial Fund :

The fund offers financial assistance worth of Rs.1,00,000 to 5 economically backward and meritorious Computer Science Students from 2019 - 2020 onwards.

College Magazine & E-Newsletter

The Principal shall be the patron of the Editorial Committee. The Editor and members of the Editorial Committee shall be nominated every year by the Principal from among the members of the staff. The College Union Chairman and Tamil Peravai Chairman will be the Ex-officio members of the committees.

Hostels

The administration of the Hostels (both Men and Women) is carried out by the Warden. The hostel rules shall apply to all residents of the hostel and the Principal's interpretation of the rules shall be final. In addition to the College Hostels, there is a Govt. Hostel in which boarding and lodging are free for all Backward, Most Backward and SC/ST students.

Library Rules

1. All the students and staff are members of the college library.
2. Each member shall be provided with a library membership Bar Code Identity card.
3. Students and staff members have to scan their ID card or enter their ID card number in the E-Gate register while entering into the library.
4. No personal belongings except purses and white papers shall be allowed inside the library. These shall be kept at the property counter.
5. All the members should present the membership Bar code Identity card at the time of book issue.
6. In case of loss of membership Bar Code Identity card, the borrower must report the matter immediately to the Principal who will issue him/her a duplicate Identity card on payment of Rs. 50/-.
7. All UG I, II and III year student can get one book, two books and three books respectively at a time.
8. Each P.G. Student can borrow five books and Research Scholar can borrow five books at a time.
9. Staff members : Teaching : 10 Books
Non-Teaching Staff : 5 Books
10. The Staff are entitled to keep the books borrowed from Library for one semester and they should return all the books within one week after reopening of the subsequent semester. Otherwise books will not be issued further. In order to ensure that all students get equal benefit of using the library books, the staff members are advised to avoid borrowing library books for the benefit of a few students.
11. Students are entitled to keep the books borrowed for two weeks from the date of issue. It should be returned on or before the due date

specified on the due date slip. It may be re-issued to the student if none has applied for that book. Only one renewal is allowed.

12. The Librarian may recall any book at any time before normal period.
13. Dictionaries, Reference books, Journals, Dissertations and works on art will not be lent out.
14. A student failing to return the book on the due date will be fined 50 paise for each day of delay.
15. All fines will be collected at the time of returning the book.
16. A student who has not paid the fine or any other charges due to the Library will not be allowed to use the Library.
17. Absence from College will not ordinarily be admitted as an excuse for the delay in return of books.
18. Members are expected to use the books with care. If a book is lost or damaged, the member is responsible to replace the book or pay a sum of money sufficient to purchase a new copy.
19. All markings, underlining or annotation of books, whether already soiled or not is forbidden. Every book will be examined as soon as it is returned. If any book is found to have been marked, soiled or damaged, the matter will be reported to the Principal for disciplinary action.
20. The Library will be kept open on all days including Sundays from 8.30 a.m. to 6.00 p.m. except National Holidays.
22. Every student who wishes to take a book shall fill in the requisition slip and present it to the stack rooms before 10.00 a.m. Books must also be returned between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on the day when library is kept open.
23. Strict silence and decorum must be observed in the library. The Librarian may refuse to issue books for breach of library rules. The Librarian shall bring to the notice of the Principal, if any student is found damaging or tearing the pages or causing disturbance or found improperly dressed.
24. Student should use the Internet centre and virtual learning centre as per the time table and should bring their ID card while entering.

25. All complaints and suggestions should be made to the Principal through the Librarian.

READING AND REFERENCE SECTIONS

The Reading and Reference sections will be kept open between 8.30 a.m. to 6.00 p.m. on all working days.

Periodicals placed on the table should in no case be removed from the reading room. Students are required to use the Magazines and Journals with care.

General Discipline

1. Students are not permitted to bring mobile phones/Laptops/other electronic goods to the class.
2. Male students are strictly prohibited from wearing Jeans pants bearing pictures and printed matters. T-Shirts and Casual/Sportive Jeans (multipockets with stripes in fading colour) are totally banned inside the campus.
3. Female students are advised to wear decent dresses (Half-saree, full saree, Chudidhar with shawl etc.,) and avoid wearing modern dresses like midi, leggings etc.
4. Students shall maintain perfect silence within the class room.
5. When the staff is entering into the class room, the students shall rise and keep standing till they are required to sit or the member of the staff takes his/her seat.
6. No student who comes to the class room after the roll call is taken, shall enter the class room without the permission of the staff-in-charge of the class.
7. Every student shall sit in the place assigned to him / her in the class room.
8. When a member of the staff directs a student to leave the class, he / she shall immediately leave the class room.
9. Students are strictly forbidden to enter other classrooms.

10. No student shall leave the class room without the permission of the staff concerned before the class is dispersed.
11. Strict silence should be maintained while moving from classroom to laboratory and vice versa.
12. Students are not allowed to loiter in the verandah during class hours, even though they happen to have no classes. In that case they should study silently either in the library or in vacant class room, causing no disturbance to the neighbouring classes.
13. Students are expected to go to the reading room/library during leisure hours and spend the time usefully.
14. Students attending lectures in class room or working in laboratories or attending debates etc., in the college premises shall maintain perfect silence.
15. Students are advised not to align themselves with any political party or any political agitation.
16. In all matters affecting the reputation of the college, students shall conduct themselves with dignity and decorum.
17. No student shall engage any member of the staff of this College for tuition without obtaining the written permission of the Principal. If he / she is found to have contravened the regulation he / she will be heavily fined or dismissed from the College.
18. Students are forbidden to organise or attend any meeting in the college or to collect money for any purpose without the prior permission of the Principal.
19. Every student shall handle college property with care and do everything in his/her power to maintain cleanliness of the building and furniture.
20. No Student shall smoke or be found drunken within the college campus.
21. Students are advised to read notices displayed in the notice board now and then. Ignorance of any notice thus put up will not be accepted as an excuse for failing to comply with it.
22. Students should not go on tour without prior written permission of the Principal. Whenever tour is permitted atleast one staff member should accompany the students. If women students are to participate

- in such tours, they have to produce the consent letters from their parents to the Principal.
23. Students are not allowed to address any authority in a body. Such combined action is subversive of good order.
 24. Students shall not address public meetings or take part in inter-collegiate competitions or radio / TV / any other programme, without the express permission of the Principal.
 25. No matter for publication in newspapers, magazines, or journals may be submitted in the name of the College by students without the permission of the Principal.
 26. Students are not permitted to participate in live/photographic modelling, fashion shows, stage shows, talk shows and / or any T.V. programme without obtaining prior permission from the Principal.
 27. No student is permitted to go out of the class/institution during regular working hours, however an out-pass is required for genuine cases.
 28. Students shall help keep the campus clean and green.
 29. Any student unable to follow the rules of the college either in word or deed, shall be deemed to have committed breach of discipline and the Principal shall have full power to inflict any of the following punishments viz., fine, loss of attendance, refusal to issue transfer certificate and conduct certificate, suspension and expulsion. The power to take disciplinary action against an erring student is inherent with to Head of the Institution.
 30. The Principal may frame and issue disciplinary rules of a permanent or temporary nature regulating the conduct of students to maintain the reputation of the college and the hostel from time to time.
 31. It is mandatory to obtain prior permission from the Principal / HOD / Hostel Warden other appropriate authorities before bringing outsiders into campus. Unauthorized entry of outsiders will be viewed seriously.
 32. Students must see the notice board of the college regularly.
 33. Every student must bring their ID card compulsory to the college. It must be produced by the students whenever demanded by a member of the staff of the college.

34. Students of the college are bound by rules of the college in the academic and disciplinary matters. The decision of the college authorities is final.
35. In case, any criminal case is registered against a student by the law enforcing authorities, he/she should intimate the same within 24 hours to the Principal, failing which he/she is liable for disciplinary action leading to expulsion.
36. **Ragging is strictly forbidden. Any one who is found guilty of ragging will be expelled from the College and shall not be admitted in any other educational institution.**
37. With regard to the matters not specified above, students shall aim at conducting themselves in a manner thoroughly suited to the functioning of the college.

**UGC REGULATION ON CURBING THE MENACE OF RAGGING IN
HIGHER EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS, 2009**

“Ragging is totally banned in the institution, and any one found guilty of ragging and or abetting ragging is liable to be punished appropriately”

Ragging means the following:

Any conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any other student, indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student or asking the students to do any act or perform something which such student will not in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student.

Punishable ingredients of ragging:

- Abetment to ragging;
- Criminal conspiracy to rag;
- Unlawful assembly and rioting while ragging;
- Public nuisance created during ragging;
- Violation of decency and morals through ragging;
- Injury to body, causing hurt or grievous hurt;
- Wrongful restraint;
- Wrongful confinement;
- Use of criminal force;
- Assault as well as sexual offences or unnatural offences;
- Extortion;
- Criminal trespass;
- Offences against property;
- Criminal intimidation;

Punishments at the institution level:

Depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence as established by the Anti Ragging Committee of the institution, the possible punishments for those found guilty of ragging at the institution level shall be any one or any combination of the following :

- Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges
- Withholding/withdrawing scholarship / fellowship and other benefits
- Debarring from appearing in any test/ examination or other evaluation process
- Withholding results
- Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
- Suspension/ expulsion from the hostel
- Cancellation of admission
- Rustication from the institution for period ranging from 1 to 4 semesters
- Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period
- Fine ranging between Rs. 25,000 /- and Rs. 1 lakh.
- Collective punishment : When the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.

Students are advised to desist from ragging and help to create a Ragging free campus.
